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Portland Metropolitan Area: June 2024


The Portland metropolitan area's unemployment rate was 4.0% in June, essentially unchanged from May (4.1%) and higher than the year-ago rate of 3.4%. Approximately 52,900 area residents were unemployed; 5,700 more than a year ago. The statewide and national unemployment rates were each 4.1%.

Total nonfarm employment was little changed in June at 1,246,700 jobs (seasonally adjusted).

Leisure and hospitality added more jobs than typical for June, fueled primarily by accommodation and food services. Growth in the arts, entertainment, and recreation component lagged seasonal trends.

Financial activities added jobs for the third consecutive month, halting (at least temporarily) its nearly two-year decline.

Professional and business services partially offset growth in other sectors. After four months of strong gains, the employment services component (i.e. temporary help) took a breather in June.



Annualized job growth in the metro area turned negative in the first quarter of 2024. The second quarter is back in the black, although just barely. Year-over-year growth averaged 2,200 jobs, April through June, or 0.5%. Employment levels are roughly 5,700 jobs above the pre-pandemic peak set in January 2020.

The Oregon Employment Department will release the Portland metropolitan area's unemployment rate and employment survey data for July on Tuesday, Aug. 20.

The Oregon Employment Department and the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) work cooperatively to develop and publish monthly payroll employment and labor force data for Oregon's metropolitan areas and counties. The estimates of monthly job gains and losses are based on a survey of businesses. The estimates of unemployment are based on a survey of households and other sources.

The Oregon Employment Department payroll employment estimates are revised quarterly using information from unemployment insurance tax records. All department publications use data from this *official Oregon series* unless noted.

The department also makes the BLS-produced nonfarm payroll employment series for metropolitan areas available. These are revised annually by BLS.

Unemployment rate is calculated by dividing unemployed by civilian labor force.

Nonfarm Payroll Employment: Official Oregon Series. Data are by place of work and cover full- and part-time employees who worked or received pay for the pay period that includes the 12th of the month. The data exclude the self-employed, volunteers, unpaid family workers, and domestics.

The Portland-Vancouver-Hillsboro metropolitan area includes Clackamas, Columbia, Multnomah, Washington, and Yamhill counties in Oregon, and Clark and Skamania counties in Washington State.
