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
Portland Metropolitan Area: July 2024

The Portland metropolitan area's unemployment rate was 4.0% in July, unchanged from June and higher than the year-ago rate of 3.5%. Approximately 59,700 area residents were unemployed; 10,000 more than a year ago. The statewide rate held steady at 4.1% and the national rate rose to 4.3%.

Employers added 1,200 jobs in July (seasonally adjusted) following a loss of 3,600 jobs in June.

Professional and business services added 2,900 jobs over the month, more than offsetting June's decline (-1,300). Gains were broad-based, with all three published components up over the month. Construction (+2,200) also bounced back from a weak June with growth spread across all sectors. Health care and social assistance continued to outperform typical trends, adding 1,400 jobs when gains of 500 are closer to the norm for July.

Industries underperforming in July include retail trade and financial activities. Weakness here only partially offset growth elsewhere in the economy.



Over the past 12 months, nonfarm payroll employment rose by 7,100 jobs, or 0.7%. Education and health care remains the fastest growing private industry (4.3%). Transportation and warehousing (1.0%) and professional and business services (0.3%) are also in the black. Retail trade (-2.4%) and construction (-1.3%) are among the industries with the steepest declines over the year.

The Oregon Employment Department will release the Portland metropolitan area's unemployment rate and employment survey data for August on Tuesday, Sept. 24.

The Oregon Employment Department and the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) work cooperatively to develop and publish monthly payroll employment and labor force data for Oregon's metropolitan areas and counties. The estimates of monthly job gains and losses are based on a survey of businesses. The estimates of unemployment are based on a survey of households and other sources.

The Oregon Employment Department payroll employment estimates are revised quarterly using information from unemployment insurance tax records. All department publications use data from this *official Oregon series* unless noted.

The department also makes the BLS-produced nonfarm payroll employment series for metropolitan areas available. These are revised annually by BLS.

Civilian labor force includes employed and unemployed individuals 16 years and older by place of residence. Employed includes payroll employment, self-employed, unpaid family workers, domestics, agriculture, and labor disputants.

Unemployment rate is calculated by dividing unemployed by civilian labor force.

Nonfarm Payroll Employment: Official Oregon Series. Data are by place of work and cover full- and part-time employees who worked or received pay for the pay period that includes the 12th of the month. The data exclude the self-employed, volunteers, unpaid family workers, and domestics.

The Portland-Vancouver-Hillsboro metropolitan area includes Clackamas, Columbia, Multnomah, Washington, and Yamhill counties in Oregon, and Clark and Skamania counties in Washington State.
