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
## Portland Metropolitan Area: September 2024

The Portland metropolitan area's unemployment rate was 4.0% in September, unchanged from August and slightly higher than the year-ago rate of 3.8%. Approximately 52,400 area residents were unemployed; 4,400 more than a year ago. The statewide rate was also 4.0% and the national rate edged down to 4.1%.

Employers cut 1,800 jobs in September following a gain of 1,500 in August (seasonally adjusted).

Private and public education didn't add the usual number of jobs for September, the traditional start of the school year, contributing to the area's overall losses. This is likely due to the timing of the school calendar and data collection. October's numbers should reflect the full extent of school hiring.

Construction also contributed to September's decline, shedding roughly four times the usual number of jobs for this time of year.



Partially offsetting these losses, leisure and hospitality cut fewer jobs than expected based on seasonal trends, and private health care continued to add jobs at a rapid clip.

Employment in the metro area reached an all-time peak in early 2023 then declined slightly as rising interest rates took a toll, especially on spending-sensitive sectors of the economy (e.g. construction, manufacturing). Then things steadied in the fall and for the past 12 months employment levels have been fairly stable, hovering within 5,000 jobs of 1,240,000.

The Oregon Employment Department will release the Portland metropolitan area's unemployment rate and employment survey data for October on Tuesday, Nov. 19

The Oregon Employment Department and the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) work cooperatively to develop and publish monthly payroll employment and labor force data for Oregon's metropolitan areas and counties. The estimates of monthly job gains and losses are based on a survey of businesses. The estimates of unemployment are based on a survey of households and other sources.

The Oregon Employment Department payroll employment estimates are revised quarterly using information from unemployment insurance tax records. All department publications use data from this *official Oregon series* unless noted.

The department also makes the BLS-produced nonfarm payroll employment series for metropolitan areas available. These are revised annually by BLS.

Civilian labor force includes employed and unemployed individuals 16 years and older by place of residence. Employed includes payroll employment, self-employed, unpaid family workers, domestics, agriculture, and labor disputants. Unemployment rate is calculated by dividing unemployed by civilian labor force.

Nonfarm Payroll Employment: Official Oregon Series. Data are by place of work and cover full- and part-time employees who worked or received pay for the pay period that includes the 12th of the month. The data exclude the self-employed, volunteers, unpaid family workers, and domestics.

The Portland-Vancouver-Hillsboro metropolitan area includes Clackamas, Columbia, Multnomah, Washington, and Yamhill counties in Oregon, and Clark and Skamania counties in Washington State.

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
