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

Portland Metropolitan Area: December 2024

The Portland metropolitan area's unemployment rate was 4.2% in December, essentially unchanged from November (4.1%). The year-ago rate was 3.9%. Approximately 56,800 area residents were unemployed; 3,400 more than a year ago. The statewide and national rates were 4.1%.

The metro area's seasonally adjusted nonfarm payroll employment declined by 4,500 jobs following a revised increase of 4,100 jobs in November.

All but three broad sectors underperformed their typical December trends. Manufacturing shed 1,400 jobs; about 1,000 more than the average December, driven by losses in semiconductors. Construction has been underperforming average trends for most of 2024 and December was no exception. This sector declined by 1,500 jobs, or roughly 1,000 more than typical. Finally, unusually large losses in



wholesale trade dampened growth in the broader sector of trade, transportation, and utilities.

On the other end of the spectrum, health care and social assistance continued its rapid growth, adding 1,300 jobs when gains of roughly 500 are the norm for this time of year. Over the past year, this sector added 10,300 jobs for a growth rate of 6.1%; far outpacing every other broad sector.

Next Press Release

The Oregon Employment Department will release the Portland metropolitan area's unemployment rate and employment survey data for January on Tuesday, March 11.

The Oregon Employment Department and the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) work cooperatively to develop and publish monthly payroll employment and labor force data for Oregon's metropolitan areas and counties. The estimates of monthly job gains and losses are based on a survey of businesses. The estimates of unemployment are based on a survey of households and other sources.

The Oregon Employment Department payroll employment estimates are revised quarterly using information from unemployment insurance tax records. All department publications use data from this *official Oregon series* unless noted.

The department also makes the BLS-produced nonfarm payroll employment series for metropolitan areas available. These are revised annually by BLS.

Civilian labor force includes employed and unemployed individuals 16 years and older by place of residence. Employed includes payroll employment, self-employed, unpaid family workers, domestics, agriculture, and labor disputants. Unemployment rate is calculated by dividing unemployed by civilian labor force.

Nonfarm Payroll Employment: Official Oregon Series. Data are by place of work and cover full- and part-time employees who worked or received pay for the pay period that includes the 12th of the month. The data exclude the self-employed, volunteers, unpaid family workers, and domestics.

The Portland-Vancouver-Hillsboro metropolitan area includes Clackamas, Columbia, Multnomah, Washington, and Yamhill counties in Oregon, and Clark and Skamania counties in Washington State.
