## **Employment in Salem MSA (Marion and Polk Counties): September 2024**

## Salem MSA's Unemployment Rate Increases to 4.0%

The Salem MSA's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 4.0% in September, up slightly from its revised rate of 3.9% in August. Oregon's statewide unemployment rate in September was 4.0%, unchanged from its revised August rate of 4.0%.

Employment gains in the Salem MSA in September were more than normal; total nonfarm employment increased by 3,400 jobs, when an employment increase of 1,800 jobs would be expected. As a result, seasonally adjusted employment was up 1,600 between August and September. With September's gains, employment is up 6.5% or 11,300 jobs above the prepandemic employment level in February 2020.

Overall, the private sector added 900 jobs in September. The largest private-sector job gains in September were reported in private education and health services (+1,300 jobs, +3.7%); and professional and business services (+200 jobs, +1.1%).

The public sector added 2,500 jobs in September. Local government education was up 2,300 jobs in September with the beginning of the school year. Federal government employment was unchanged and state government gained 200 jobs in September.

Civilian labor force includes employed and unemployed individuals 16 years and older by place of residence. Employed includes payroll employment, self-employed, unpaid family workers, domestics, agriculture, and labor disputants. Unemployment rate is calculated by dividing unemployed by civilian labor force.

Nonfarm Payroll Employment: Official Oregon Series. Data are by place of work and cover full- and part-time employees who worked or received pay for the pay period that includes the 12th of the month. The data exclude the self-employed, volunteers, unpaid family workers, and domestics.

The Oregon Employment Department and the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) work cooperatively to develop and publish monthly payroll employment and labor force data for Oregon's metropolitan areas and counties. The estimates of monthly job gains and losses are based on a survey of businesses. The estimates of unemployment are based on a survey of households and other sources.

The Oregon Employment Department payroll employment estimates are revised quarterly using information from unemployment insurance tax records. All department publications use data from this *official Oregon series* unless noted.

The department also makes the BLS-produced nonfarm payroll employment series for metropolitan areas available. These are revised annually by BLS.
