## Employment in Salem MSA (Marion and Polk Counties): January 2025

## Salem MSA's Unemployment Rate up to 5.1%

Employment losses in the Salem MSA in January were less than normal; total nonfarm employment decreased by 2,300 jobs, when an employment decrease of 3,000 jobs would be expected. As a result, seasonally adjusted employment was up 700 between December and January. With January's gains, employment is up 7.6% or 13,300 jobs above the pre-pandemic employment level in February 2020.

Overall, private-sector employment was down 1,900 in January. The largest private-sector job losses in January were reported in retail trade (-600 jobs, -3.1%) and construction (-500 jobs, -3.8%).

The public sector shed 400 jobs in January. Local government was down 500 jobs in January. State government employment was up 100 and federal government employment was unchanged in January.

The Salem MSA's unadjusted unemployment rate was 5.1% in January, up from its revised rate of 4.2% in December. Oregon's statewide unadjusted unemployment rate in January was 5.4%, up from its revised December rate of 4.3%.

Civilian labor force includes employed and unemployed individuals 16 years and older by place of residence. Employed includes payroll employment, self-employed, unpaid family workers, domestics, agriculture, and labor disputants. Unemployment rate is calculated by dividing unemployed by civilian labor force.

Nonfarm Payroll Employment: Official Oregon Series. Data are by place of work and cover full- and part-time employees who worked or received pay for the pay period that includes the 12th of the month. The data exclude the self-employed, volunteers, unpaid family workers, and domestics.

The Oregon Employment Department and the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) work cooperatively to develop and publish monthly payroll employment and labor force data for Oregon's metropolitan areas and counties. The estimates of monthly job gains and losses are based on a survey of businesses. The estimates of unemployment are based on a survey of households and other sources.

The Oregon Employment Department payroll employment estimates are revised quarterly using information from unemployment insurance tax records. All department publications use data from this *official Oregon series* unless noted.

The department also makes the BLS-produced nonfarm payroll employment series for metropolitan areas available. These are revised annually by BLS.
