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## **Employment in South Coast: January 2025 Coos County Sees Gains Over the Year, Curry Loses Jobs**

Coos County total payroll employment fell by 230 jobs in January. Private education and health services lost 40 jobs. Construction employment fell by 30 jobs. Both retail trade and transportation, warehousing, and utilities lost 20 jobs. Professional and business services added 70 jobs in January. Government employment slipped by 170 over the month with losses in local education (-130) and losses of 10 in federal, state, and Indian tribal local government.

Since January 2024, Coos County has gained 310 payroll jobs, an increase of 1.4%. Employment gains occurred in professional and business services (+130); manufacturing (+60); and leisure and hospitality (+50). Government employment rose by 90 jobs over the year, with local government accounting for most of the gain.

Curry County payroll employment fell by 100 jobs in January. Leisure and hospitality lost 30 jobs. Trade, transportation, and utilities also lost 30 jobs over the month.

Over the past year, Curry County payroll employment fell by 80 jobs over the year, a decrease of 1.2%. Losses were estimated in leisure and hospitality (-70); retail trade (-50); and financial activities (-20). A few industries added jobs over the year including manufacturing (+30), healthcare (+20), and state government (+20).

The Oregon Employment Department plans to release the February county and metropolitan area unemployment rates and employment survey data on Tuesday, April 1<sup>st</sup>, and the statewide unemployment rate and employment survey data for February on Wednesday, March 26<sup>th</sup>.

The Oregon Employment Department and the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) work cooperatively to develop and publish monthly payroll employment and labor force data for Oregon's metropolitan areas and counties. The estimates of monthly job gains and losses are based on a survey of businesses. The estimates of unemployment are based on a survey of households and other sources.

The Oregon Employment Department payroll employment estimates are revised quarterly using information from unemployment insurance tax records. All department publications use data from this *official Oregon series* unless noted.

The department also makes the BLS-produced nonfarm payroll employment series for metropolitan areas available. These are revised annually by BLS.
