Employment in Yamhill County: December 2023

Yamhill County's Unemployment Rate Edges up to 3.4%

Yamhill County's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 3.4% in December, edging up from its revised rate of 3.3% in November. Oregon's statewide unemployment rate in December was 3.7%, up from its revised November rate of 3.6%.

Yamhill County's employment losses in December were smaller than normal; total nonfarm employment decreased 330 jobs, when an employment decrease of 480 jobs would be expected. As a result, seasonally adjusted employment was up 150 in December. Employment is 1,280 jobs (+3.6%) above the pre-pandemic level in February 2020.

The private sector shed 270 jobs in December. The largest industry employment losses in December were in private educational services (-180 jobs, -5.4%); manufacturing (-90 jobs, -1.3%); and leisure and hospitality (-40 jobs, -1.0%).

Sectors adding the most employment in December were health care and social assistance (+50 jobs, +0.8%) and retail trade (+40 jobs, +1.0%).

Yamhill County's public-sector employment was down 60 in December. Local government employment decreased 70 in December. Federal government employment was up 10 and state government employment was unchanged in December.

Civilian labor force includes employed and unemployed individuals 16 years and older by place of residence. Employed includes payroll employment, self-employed, unpaid family workers, domestics, agriculture, and labor disputants. Unemployment rate is calculated by dividing unemployed by civilian labor force.

Nonfarm Payroll Employment: Data are by place of work and cover full- and part-time employees who worked or received pay for the pay period that includes the 12th of the month. The data exclude the self-employed, volunteers, unpaid family workers, and domestics.

The Oregon Employment Department and the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) work cooperatively to develop and publish monthly payroll employment and labor force data for Oregon's metropolitan areas and counties. The estimates of monthly job gains and losses are based on a survey of businesses. The estimates of unemployment are based on a survey of households and other sources.

The Oregon Employment Department payroll employment estimates are revised quarterly using information from unemployment insurance tax records. All department publications use data from this *official Oregon series* unless noted.

The department also makes the BLS-produced nonfarm payroll employment series for metropolitan areas available. These are revised annually by BLS.
