



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February 2025 Employment and Unemployment in Oregon's Counties

Between February 2024 and February 2025, total nonfarm employment rose in three of Oregon's six broad regions, was unchanged in one, and decreased in two. The Willamette Valley experienced the fastest job growth over the year at 1.7%. Employment also grew relatively quickly in Central Oregon (1.3%). Employment growth was slower along the Coast (0.5%). Employment was unchanged in the five Portland-metro counties. Employment decreased in Eastern Oregon (-0.1%) and in Southern Oregon (-0.3%).

Over-the-year between February 2024 and February 2025, non-seasonally adjusted unemployment rates increased in 30 of Oregon's 36 counties and decreased in six. Twelve counties had unadjusted unemployment rates at or below Oregon's unadjusted rate of 5.2%.

Grant County had Oregon's highest non-seasonally adjusted unemployment rate in February at 8.9%. Other counties with relatively high unadjusted unemployment rates were Klamath (8.2%) and Morrow (8.1%). Benton County registered the lowest unadjusted unemployment rate in February at 4.2%.

Sherman and Hood River counties also had relatively low unadjusted unemployment rates, at 4.4% and 4.5%, respectively.

This release typically discusses seasonally adjusted local area unemployment rates. However, through June 2025, seasonally adjusted data are not available for Oregon metropolitan statistical areas (MSAs) or other MSAs around the country. Labor force statistics for Oregon MSAs are produced by the U.S. Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics. New MSA definitions resulting from the 2020 Census are being incorporated into the history of the data series back to 1990, as well as other updates to the processing of labor force estimates for substate areas. (1) Civilian labor force includes employed and unemployed individuals 16 years and older by place of residence. Employed includes nonfarm payroll employment, self-employed, unpaid family workers, domestics, agriculture, and labor disputants. Unemployment rate is calculated by dividing unemployed by civilian labor force. Data are not seasonally adjusted unless otherwise noted.

(2) The Bend metropolitan area includes Crook, Deschutes, and Jefferson counties

(3) The Portland-Vancouver-Hillsboro metropolitan area includes Clackamas, Columbia, Multnomah, Washington, and Yamhill counties in Oregon, and Clark and Skamania counties in Washington State.
