




Employment grew by 29,100 jobs from November 2023 to November 2024

Oregon's Year-Over-Year Job Growth/Decline Seasonally Adjusted






Women's Employment as Share of Total Employment by Industry



Number of Oregon residents, all ages


Baseline Forecast | Zero Migration Scenario


