



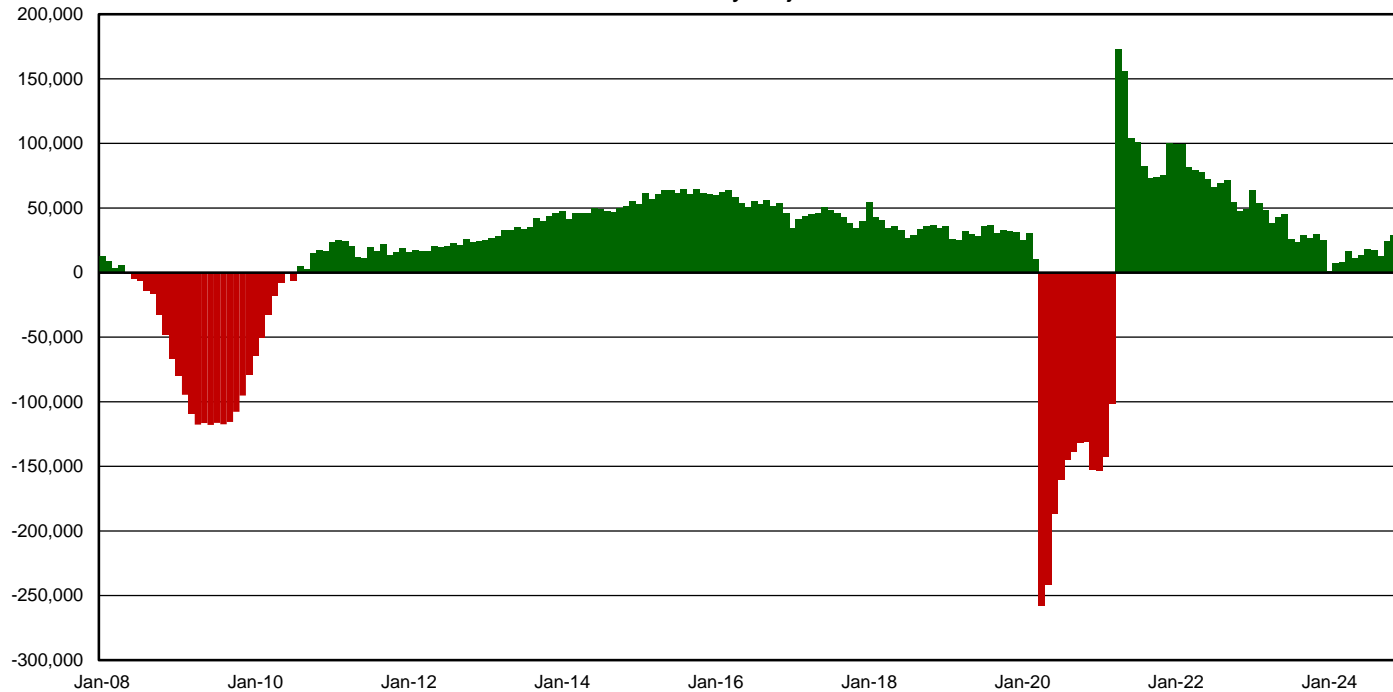

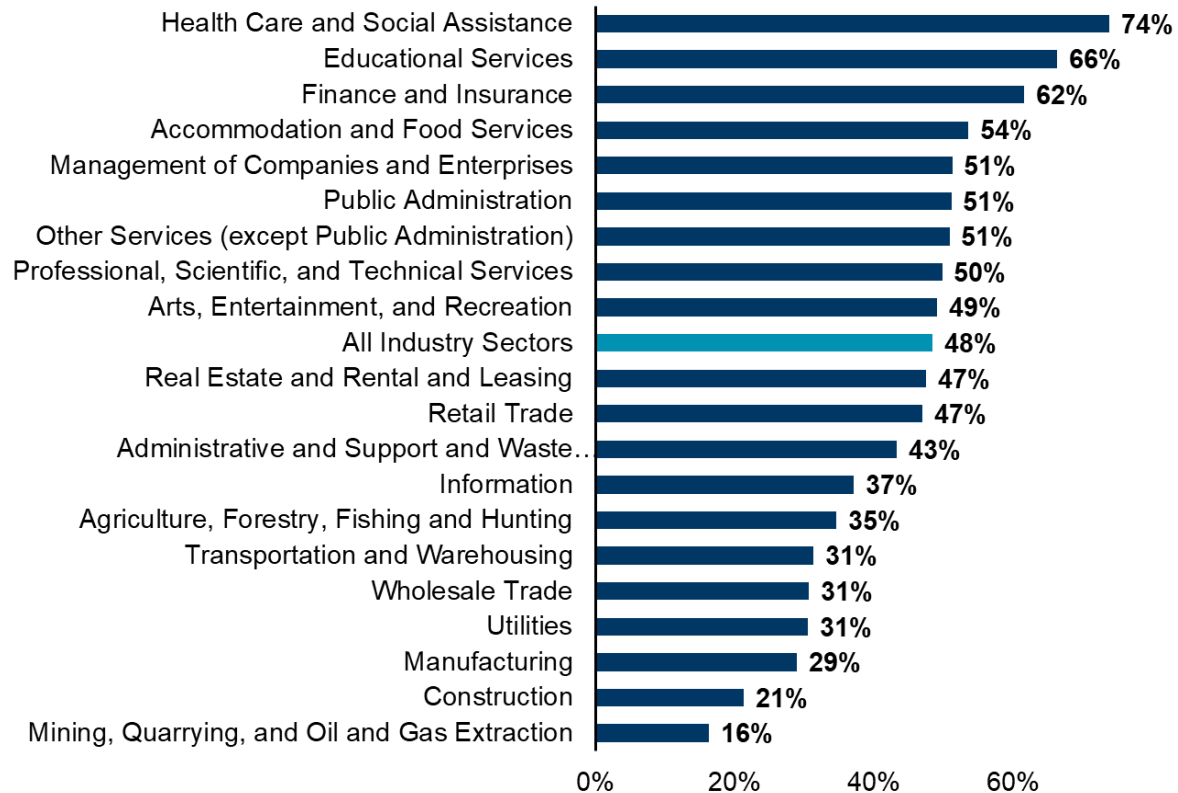
# Employment grew by 29,100 jobs from November 2023 to November 2024

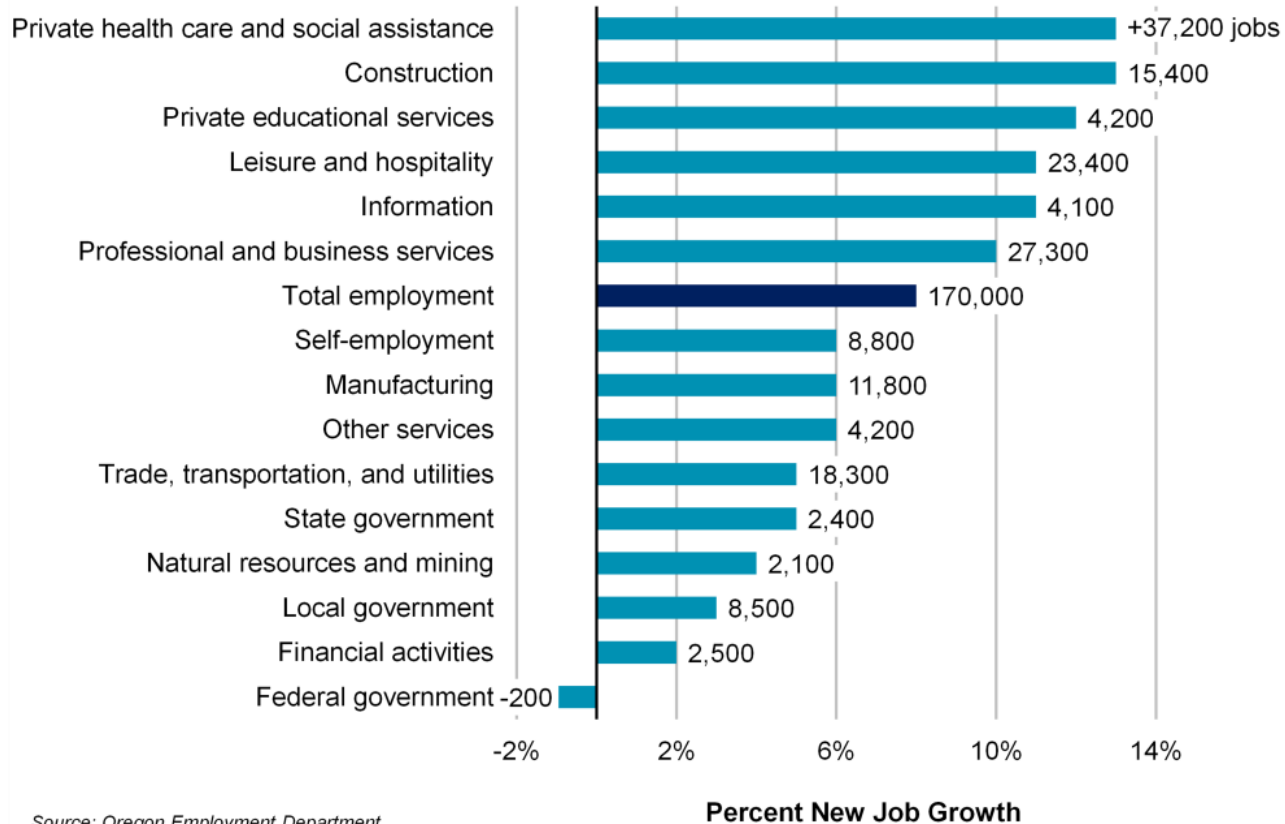
## Women's Employment as Share of Total Employment by Industry

## Health Care and Social Assistance Leads Long-Term Employment Growth Oregon Industry Projections, 2023-2033



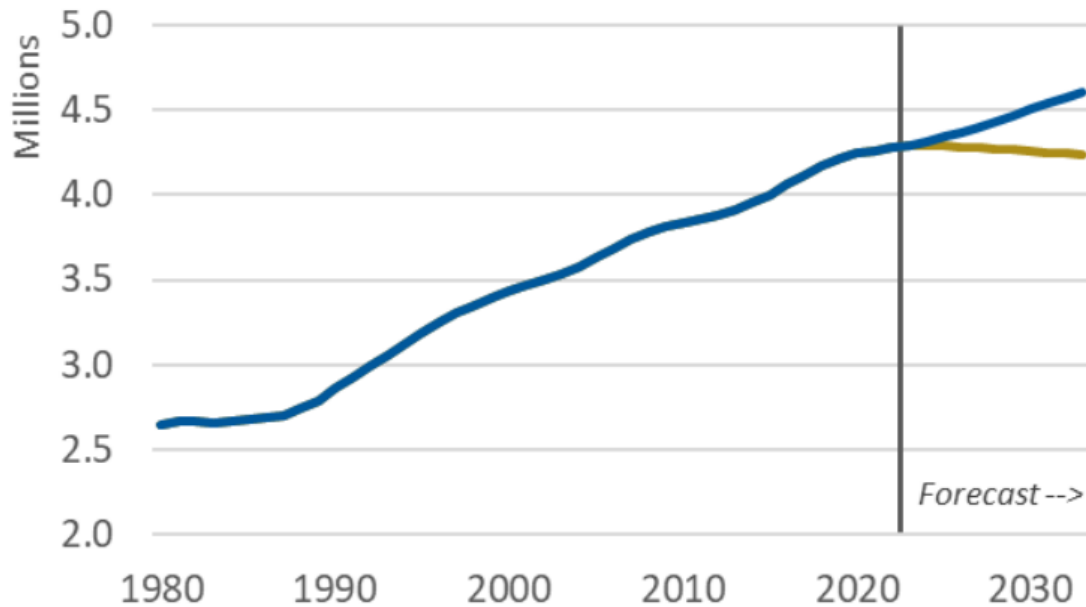

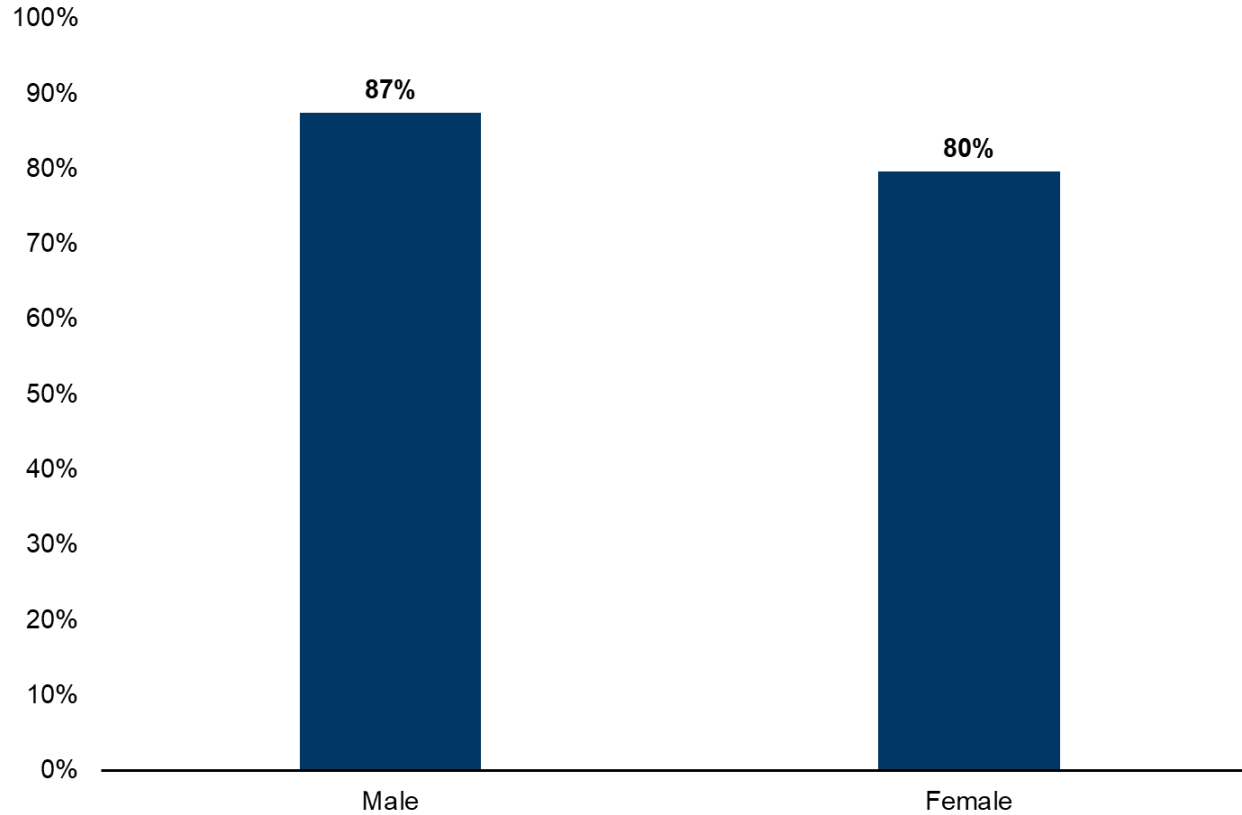
Number of Oregon residents, all ages
