




SOUTHWESTERN OREGON HAD THE HIGHEST UNEMPLOYMENT RATE IN NOVEMBER.

November 2024, Seasonally Adjusted



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



Oregon Job Change and Average Pay by Industry November 2023 - November 2024 Job Change, 2023 Average Pay




OREGON EMPLOYERS ADDED 5,100 NONFARM PAYROLL JOBS IN NOVEMBER.

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














L&H, TRADE, LOCAL GOVERNMENT, HEALTHCARE TOP INDUSTRIES FOR EMPLOYMENT






TOTAL NONFARM EMPLOYMENT DOWN BY 40 (0.2%)
