

**TOTAL NONFARM EMPLOYMENT UP 1.5% FROM PRE-PANDEMIC LEVEL** 



### MOST REGIONS GREW, COLUMBIA LAGGED A LITTLE BIT


## Change in Nonfarm Employment, Dec '22-Dec '23, Seasonally Adjusted





## LINCOLN COUNTY GREW BY 0.7% FROM 2021-2022


## Lincoln County Population Change 2021-2022


#### Employment Change, Lincoln County, Dec '22-Dec '23
