

Rogue Valley Real Gross Domestic Product 2002-2023




In real, or inflationadjusted dollars, Jackson County total GDP rose from about \$6.6 billion in 2001 to \$10.3 billion in in 2023.


U.S. Oregon and Rogue Valley Percent Change in Real Gross Domestic Product 2002-2023



The Rogue Valley has roughly matched the state and national trend over time. Interestingly during the year of the COVID pandemic recession, the U.S. GDP fell by 2.2% whereas Jackson County's barely budged, down by just 0.1%. The Rogue Valley did experience GDP decline in 2022 of 0.6% in Jackson County while the U.S. economy expanded

Employment Department Jackson County Gross Domestic Product by Sector 2023




largest shares of economic output are in the financial activities; private educational services, health care and social assistance; and retail trade sectors in the Rogue Valley

Oregon and Rogue Valley Per Capita Personal Income, 1969-2023




Jackson County's PCPI increase was slightly better than Oregon statewide (5.8%) and the U.S. increase (5.4%).




Unemployment Rate



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

There are 14,200 Long-Term Unemployed Oregonians 16% of All Unemployed



COVID-19 Job Changes Compared to Great Recession Job Changes








The number of online ads in the Medford metro area was 2,900 in December. The number of new ads decreased by 150 over the month.




Where do Workers who are employed in Ashland live?





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PATENTS FROM JACKSON COUNTY SHOW AN UPTICK POST COVID- OREGON TRENDING LOWER OVER TIME





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CONSTRUCTION 5,340 JOBS IN DECEMBER 2024 – DOWN 90 OVER THE YEAR






MANUFACTURING 6,660 JOBS IN DECEMBER- DOWN 320 OVER THE YEAR














HEALTH CARE AND SOCIAL ASSISTANCE 19,410 JOBS- UP 980 JOBS SINCE DECEMBER 2023





Expected Job Changes by Industry Sector Over The Year (4Q2024 - 4Q2025)





- Economic activity in the Twelfth District (Alaska, Arizona, California, Hawaii, Idaho, Nevada, Oregon, Utah, and Washington) was stable on balance during the October to mid-November reporting period.
- Employment levels were largely unchanged, and employee turnover was stable in recent weeks.
- Retail sales and activity in the consumer and business services sectors held steady over the reporting period.
- Activity in the manufacturing sector increased a bit, while conditions in the agriculture and resource-related sectors softened slightly.
- Residential real estate conditions improved somewhat, and commercial real estate conditions were varied but stable.
- Demand for assistance with affordable housing, health-care services, and food remained high from communities across the District.
- Looking ahead, contacts overall expressed slightly more optimism about economic conditions.
