


Total Nonfarm Employment Trend (Seasonally-Adjusted)


Multnomah Employment Change by Industry, Dec. 2023 to Dec. 2024





Portland MSA Unemployment Rate Remains Low at 4.2%


- U.S. rate is 4.1%

 - 20-year: 5.8%






Unemployment Rates in Oregon Counties


Current Rate (December 2024), Record High, and Record Low for Each County, Seasonally Adjusted

















Inflow/Outflow Job Counts in 2022 All Workers




East Portland Residents & Laborers, as of 2022


Where East Portland Residents Work – Private Primary Jobs



Where East Portland Workers Live – Private Primary Jobs




Net Migration in Multnomah County by Age, 2022 to 2023


Net Migration in Multnomah County by Household Income, 2022 to 2023


