

Unemployment Rate





Rogue Valley Real Gross Domestic Product 2013-2023




In real, or inflationadjusted dollars, Jackson County total GDP rose from about \$6.6 billion in 2001 to \$10.3 billion in in 2023.


Josephine County real GDP climbed from about \$1.9 billion to \$3.9 billion over that time.




ROGUE VALLEY BUSINESSES WITH PAYROLL EMPLOYMENT



COVID-19 Job Changes Compared to Great Recession Job Changes














WHERE WORKERS EMPLOYED IN MEDFORD LIVE




WHERE WORKERS EMPLOYED IN GRANTS PASS LIVE- 2022












Oregon Business Applications 2013-2024





PATENTS FROM JACKSON COUNTY SHOW AN UPTICK POST COVID- OREGON TRENDING LOWER OVER TIME




FEW PATENTS ASSIGNMENTS - ABOUT 2 PER YEAR IN JOSEPHINE COUNTY



DECLINING TREND IN TECH-HEAVY MULTNOMAH COUNTY SINCE 2022




Rogue Valley Payroll Employment at Firms 0-1 year old






Share Rogue Valley Payroll Employment at Firms 0-1 year old

Payroll Employment at Rogue Valley Businesses 0-1 year old- 4Q 2023







