


NONFARM PAYROLLS IN OREGON GAINED 4,400 JOBS IN FEBRUARY



Oregon Civilian Labor Force, Seasonally Adjusted





Current Rate (February 2024), Record High, and Record Low for Each County, Seasonally Adjusted





EASTERN OREGON GREW AT THE FASTEST RATE OF ANY BROAD REGION OVER THE YEAR


Over-the-Year Employment Change by Region










2022 CRAFT BREWERY ECONOMIC IMPACT DATA (BREWERS ASSOCIATION)




Economic Impact per Capita (21+ Adult)



Oregon's Brewery Employment, January 2017 - September 2023




BREWERY AND BREWPUB EMPLOYMENT HAS BEEN SLOW TO RECOVER



Establishments in Oregon's Brewery Industry






Oregon's Quarterly Payroll, Brewery Industry

News Dregon Loses 30 Breweries in 2023

Oregon, one of the initial hotbeds of craft beer along with California, Washington and Colorado, has see over 30 craft breweries, cideries and taprooms close down in 2023, the highest number of any year.

It comes as no surprise that brewery closings would peak last year given the challenges confronting the industry prior to 2020 and then compounded by the pandemic. But to see the number of 30 locations closing in a state with a total of 318 craft breweries (in 2022) is an eye opener.



Do you have occasion to use alcoholic beverages such as liquor, wine or beer, or are you a total abstainer? **% Yes, drink**








OREGON'S LABOR FORCE PARTICIPATION RATE WAS 62.7% IN FEBRUARY.





U.S. and Oregon Unemployed to Job Vacancy Ratios Still Low




 Oregon's unemployed-to-vacancy ratio has been below pre-pandemic levels for the past two years.

- The U.S. ratio was 0.7 in October 2023, its tenth straight quarter below 1. It reached 4.3 in April 2020 after several years around 1-to-1.
- ✓ Oregon had 1.1 unemployed per job vacancy in fall 2023, still much lower than the peak of 5.7 in May 2020.
