







OREGON HAS MORE JOBS NOW THAN BEFORE THE PANDEMIC RECESSION




More than half (23) of all counties have regained their total pandemic recession job losses.




Central Oregon Job Recovery, Percentage relative to February 2020

COVID-19 Job Changes Compared to Great Recession Job Changes








COVID-19 Job Changes Compared to Great Recession Job Changes

February 2023 to February 2024, Seasonally Adjusted Nonfarm Employment



Over-the-year Employment Change by MSA



The number of Oregon job vacancies declined from 2022 to 2023, as the recovery from the 2020 pandemic recession slowed. Employers reported about six out of 10 openings were difficult to fill in 2023.

A typical job vacancy tends to be for a full-time, permanent position. 39% require education beyond high school and 58% require previous experience.





East Cascades Job Vacancies by Experience Requirement, 2023



East Cascades Job Vacancies by Hourly Wage, 2023







Oregon Civilian Labor Force, Seasonally Adjusted




OREGON'S LABOR FORCE PARTICIPATION RATE WAS 62.7% IN FEBRUARY




UNEMPLOYMENT RATES HAVE SLIGHTLY INCREASED BUT REMAIN HISTORICALLY LOW

Unemployment Rate





Current Rate (February 2024), Record High, and Record Low for Each County, Seasonally Adjusted



BEND-REDMOND MSA LABOR FORCE


Labor Force in the **Bend-Redmond MSA**, 1990-2024

(Seasonally Adjusted)




Number of Employed in the **Bend-Redmond MSA**, 1990-2024
