
# **Jobs Recovery**

Job Recovery from COVID Recession Total Nonfarm Employment Index, Feb. 2020 = 0





# Growth Rates for All States by Sector January 2023 - January 2024, Seasonally Adjusted



#### Oregon has more jobs now than before the pandemic recession




More than half (23) of all counties have regained their total pandemic recession job losses.


More jobs than before recession (100% +)

#### Employment recovery is uneven by industry




## Unemployment is near record lows

#### Seasonally Adjusted Unemployment Rate






## 2023 saw fewer job vacancies, but still elevated






#### Recent data shows a low jobseeker to vacancy ratio

#### Real wages have gone up in Oregon but have stabilized in recent months










# **Industry Growth**




Total Employment vs. Health Care


#### Projected Employment Change, 2022-2032





Educational requirements are more varied in this group
















# **Oregon's Pandemic Population Change**


Percent change from Census 2020 (April 1, 2020) to 2023 Estimates (July 1, 2023)

Number of residents moving in minus the number moving out






#### Housing construction lags population growth in recent years





#### Housing costs are higher than the U.S. and the gap has grown


#### Median Housing Value
