






MANY BROAD SECTORS OF OREGON'S ECONOMY HAVE LOST JOBS OVER THE PAST YEAR.


OEA EXPECTS OREGON TO GAIN ABOUT 15,800 JOBS IN THE NEXT 12 MONTHS.

OREGON'S LABOR FORCE PARTICIPATION RATE WAS 62.7% IN FEBRUARY.


Oregon Labor Force Participation Rate


RETIREMENTS PICKED UP IN 2023 AFTER A LULL IN 2022






Average Annual Unemployment by Age Category







TOTAL NONFARM EMPLOYMENT UP 2.4% FROM PRE-PANDEMIC LEVEL



GOVERNMENT AND HEALTH SERVICES DRIVING JOB GAINS IN NW


Change in Employment by Industry, Mar '23-Mar '24

JOB VACANCIES WERE DOWN IN '23, BUT STILL HIGHER THAN PRE-PANDEMIC












