



MANY BROAD SECTORS OF OREGON'S ECONOMY HAVE LOST JOBS OVER THE PAST YEAR.


Oregon Job Change and Average Pay by Industry

Expected Job Changes by Industry Sector Over The Year (2Q2024 - 2Q2025)



OREGON'S LABOR FORCE PARTICIPATION RATE WAS 62.9% IN APRIL.


Oregon's Labor Force Participation Rate

Share of all Oregonians 16 years and older with a job or looking for work



SOUTHWESTERN OREGON HAD THE HIGHEST UNEMPLOYMENT RATE IN APRIL.


Unemployment Rates by Local Workforce Area




TOTAL NONFARM EMPLOYMENT UP 3.6% FROM PRE-PANDEMIC LEVEL





MOST COUNTIES HAVE GROWN FROM PRE-PANDEMIC LEVELS






LOCAL EDUCATION AND HEALTH SERVICES DRIVING JOB GAINS IN NW






LOCAL EDUCATION, L&H, AND TRADE HAVE LARGEST EMPLOYMENT IN REGION





DRAMATIC RECOVERY PAST TWO YEARS, STILL ROOM TO GROW






TIGHT LABOR MARKET PERSISTS IN NW OREGON

Clatsop County Population Change, 2022-2023






