
# Consumer Spending Continues to Increase (Even Accounting for Inflation)







- Great Recession, 2007-2009- COVID-19






## **Unemployment Rate is Low**

Current Rate (July 2024), Record High, and Record Low for Each County, Seasonally Adjusted








# Zooming in on the Lloyd District



## Lloyd District Employment Grew 8% and Real Payroll Grew 34% Over the Decade, But Remains Below Peak Employent





#### Change in Employment Level in Lloyd District 2021 to 2022






## **Construction Shows Strongest Recovery**

#### Change in Employment Level in Lloyd District 2019 to 2022














More Than One in Five Multnomah County Jobs is Held by Workers Aged 55 or Older



# The declining birth rate means that the workforce won't be naturally replaced


#### Multnomah County Population by Age, 2022


# Normally, workforce is supplemented by in-migration, but Multnomah County is currently seeing net out-migration


## **Bad Housing Market for Buyers**
