


Unemployment Rates in Oregon Counties Current Rate (August 2024), Record High, and Record Low for Each County, Seasonally Adjusted

Labor Market Short-Term Loosening, Long Term Tightness




Though Labor Market is Loosening, Job Demand Remains Elevated












Not Enough Young People to Replace the Outgoing Workforce

Oregon Net Domestic Migration


Number of households moving into the state minus the number moving out of the state



Baseline | Zero Migration | Zero Migration Latent Labor Force





Health Care Occupations Mostly In Demand

- Industries
 - Health care and social assistance represented 42% of all vacancies, with 25,400.
 - Retail trade had 7,000 vacancies in summer.
 - Manufacturing had 4,900 vacancies.
- Most difficult to fill occupations
 - Preschool teachers
 - Maids and housekeeping cleaners
 - Medical assistants
 - Registered nurses




Oregon Job Vacancies by Educational Requirement, Summer 2024

Wage is higher for Occupations Requiring Higher Educational Attainment


Average Hourly Wage for Oregon Job Vacancies, by Educational Requirement, Summer 2024

Oregon Job Vacancies Requiring Previous Experience Summer 2024






Job Demand In The Next Decade



Replacement Workers Will Be Needed

- Over 90% of job openings in the Portland Tri-County over the next decade will be replacement openings
- Workers will be needed for all industries even if an industry is not projected to grow in employment numbers

- The fast growth in service occupations is mainly caused by the job losses incurred in 2020






