# NORTHEAST OREGON LABOR MARKET INFORMATION

### 2023 IN REVIEW: NORTHEAST OREGON

- Northeast Oregon's nonfarm employment added 210 jobs (+1.1%) from 2022 to 2023
- Baker County: -80 jobs (-1.4%); Union County: +190 jobs (+1.8%); Wallowa County: +100 jobs (+3.7%)
- Northeast Oregon's unemployment rate decreased by 0.5 percentage point to 4.1% over the year – its lowest annual rate since comparable statistics began in 1990
- Baker County: 4.3% (lowest); Union County: 3.9% (lowest); Wallowa County: 4.4% (lowest)
- Northeast Oregon's population decreased 0.1% to 50,893
- Baker County: -10 (0.0%); Union County: -233 (0.1%); Wallowa County: 0 (0.0%)




## **OCTOBER 2024**

#### **Unemployment Rate – Seasonally Adjusted**

- Northeast Oregon: 4.5% (tied for 3<sup>rd</sup> lowest October rate since 1990)
  - 0.3 percentage point higher than October 2023
- Baker County: 4.2% (2<sup>nd</sup> lowest October rate)
  - 0.2 percentage point lower than October 2023
- Union County: 4.7% (3<sup>rd</sup> lowest October rate)
  - 0.6 percentage point higher than October 2023
- Wallowa County: 4.4% (2<sup>nd</sup> lowest October rate)
  - 0.1 percentage point higher than October 2023



#### SEASONALLY ADJUSTED UNEMPLOYMENT RATE



County-level comparable statistics began in 1990.

Pre-pandemic series low was 4.3% in Sep, Oct, Nov of 2019.


Returned to pre-pandemic low of 4.3% Dec 2021 – Mar 2022.

Hit new series low of 4.0% Apr 2023 – Jul 2023.

Currently at 4.5% (between 4.4% and 4.5% from Feb 2024 – Oct 2024.

- Public sector employment +20 jobs.


Union County's total nonfarm employment +50 from October 2023.




























#### PRIVATE EDUCATION AND HEALTH SERVICES LEADS LONG-TERM INDUSTRY GROWTH

#### Eastern Six Industry Projections, 2022-2032




Private education and health services is projected to grow the fastest (+16%).

Construction is projected to grow the second-fastest (+14%).

Transportation, warehousing, and utilities; professional and business services; other services; and leisure and hospitality are also expected to grow faster than total employment.

#### **JOB OPENINGS BY INDUSTRY**




The retail trade sector is expected to have the greatest number of job openings between 2022 and 2032.

Ninety-five percent of total job openings are expected due to the need to replace workers who retire, leave the labor force for other reasons, or make a major occupational change, with the remaining openings due to new or expanding businesses.




#### OVER NINE OUT OF TEN TOTAL JOB OPENINGS ARE REPLACEMENT OPENINGS



Service occupations (which include food preparation and serving workers, personal appearance workers, protective services, and building and grounds cleaning) rank first in most job openings. The projected fast growth in service occupations is still reflective of recovery from job losses incurred in 2020.



#### **HEALTHCARE SUPPORT LEADS OCCUPATIONAL GROWTH**



The healthcare support occupational group is projected to grow the fastest at 20.1%. The growing elderly population, which typically has increased healthcare needs compared to younger groups, will in turn increase demand for caregiving and therapy services.

Community and social service occupations are the second fastest-growing occupational group at 16.1%.



#### HEALTHCARE OCCUPATIONS TOP LIST OF FASTEST-GROWING OCCUPATIONS



Healthcare occupations and those associated with healthcare (including mental health) for humans and animals accounted for 11 of the 18 fastest-growing occupations.
